MAKING TASKS

Ancient Greek Show Resources

If all the children can be dressed in black that will be great for the show.

Group one:

Print out vases and ask the children to illustrate 'Greek Olympic Show' the children can look Ancient Greek vases for inspiration. They will be held up at the beginning of the show by the children and are optional. A Zeus mask and some lightning bolts.

Group two:

The statue masks which we would assume that are white but in fact they painted to look life like.

Group three:

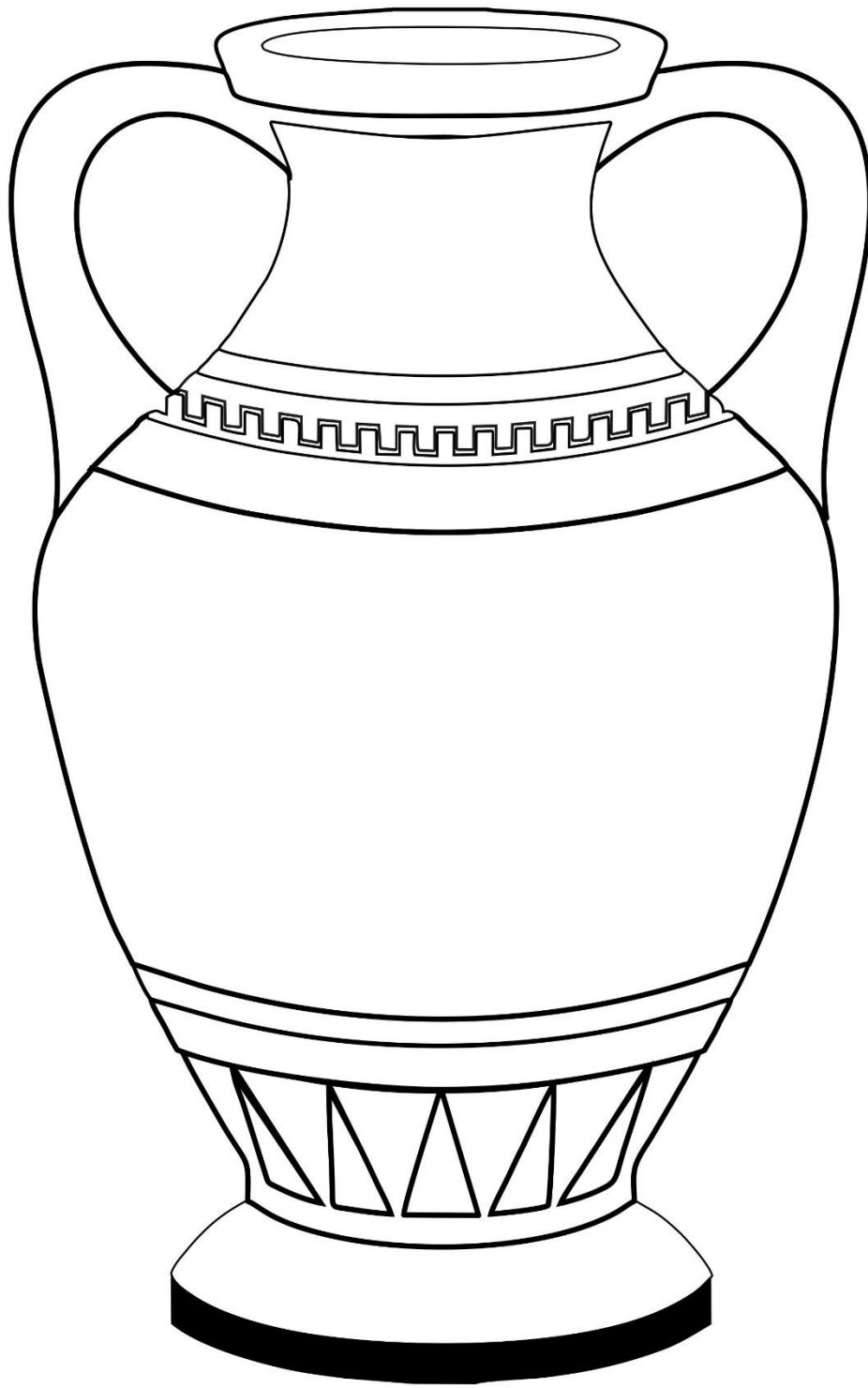
Research at modern Paralympic and Olympic champions with the children and ask them to select three or four. See if the children can look for champions from from other era's for instance Jesse Owens.

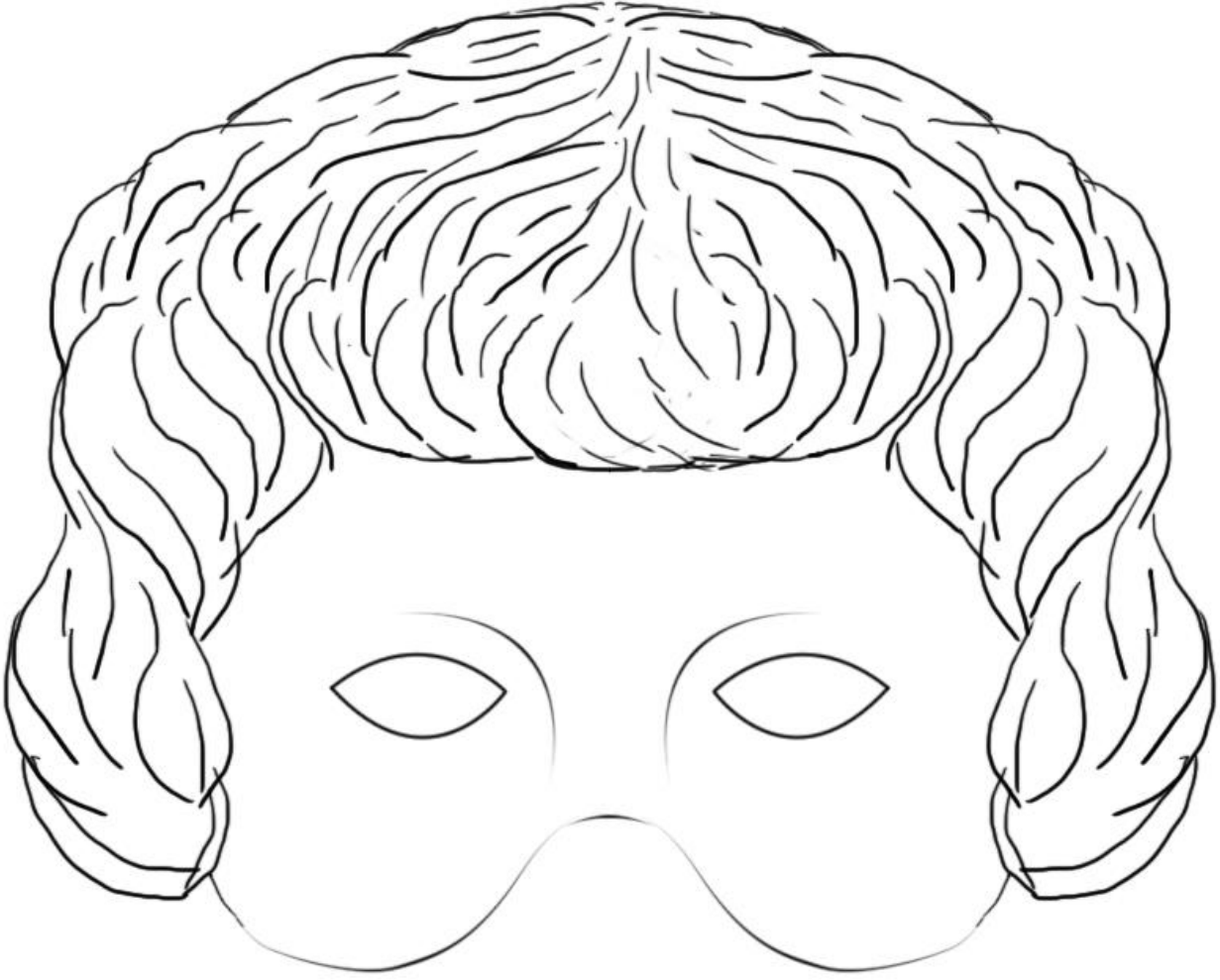
Group four:

If you can make 3 banners for the city states: Megarans, Athenians and Spartans and little one for Milo smaller and only held by one person. You can make scrolls for the 'Judges' and 'commentators' to write their script parts.











Laurel Wreath crown

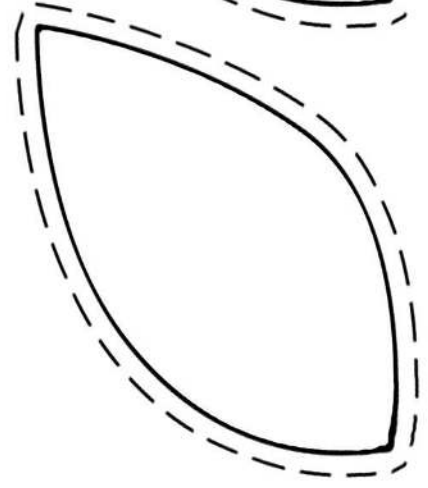
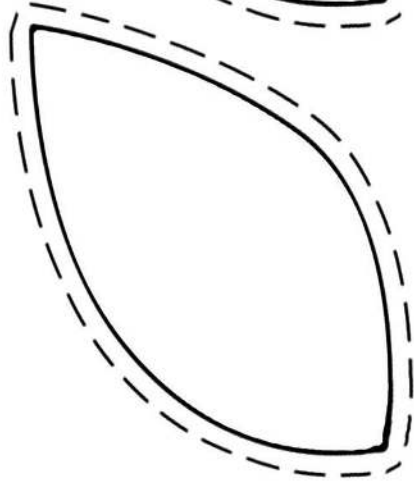
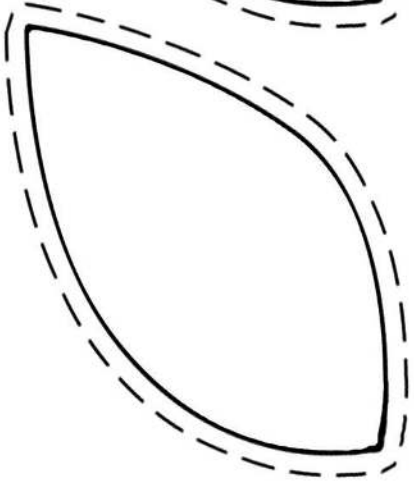
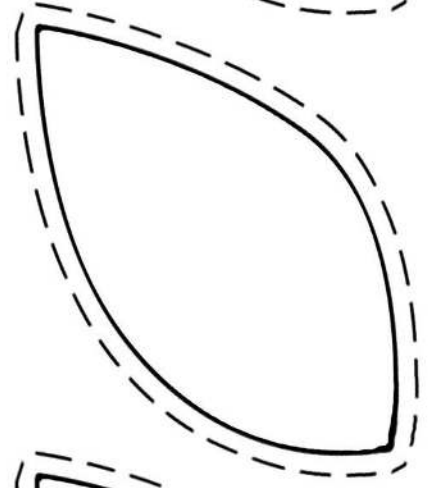
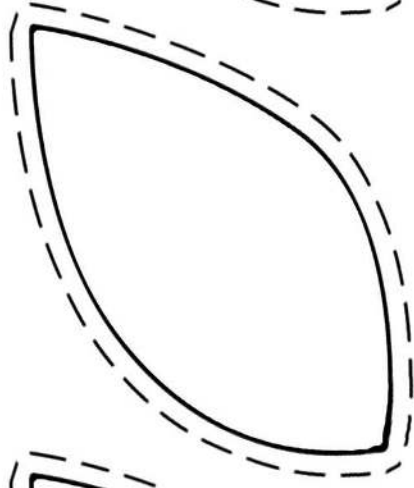
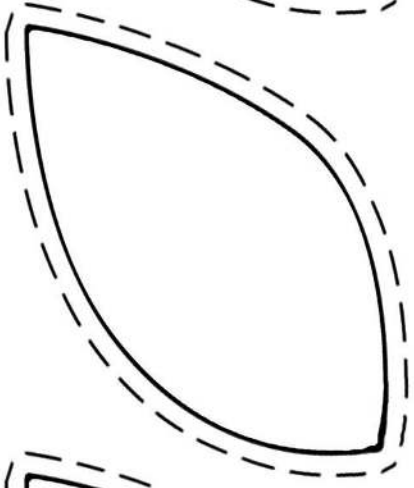
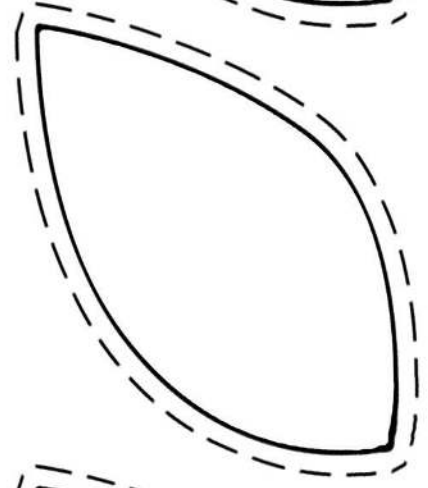
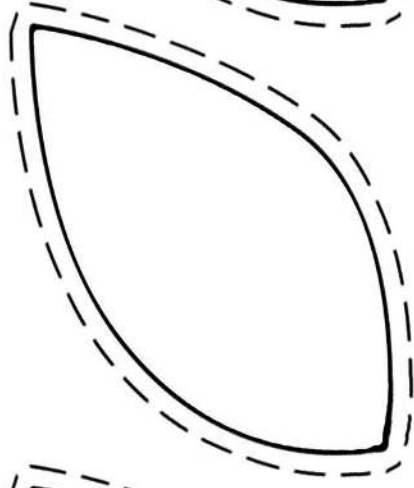
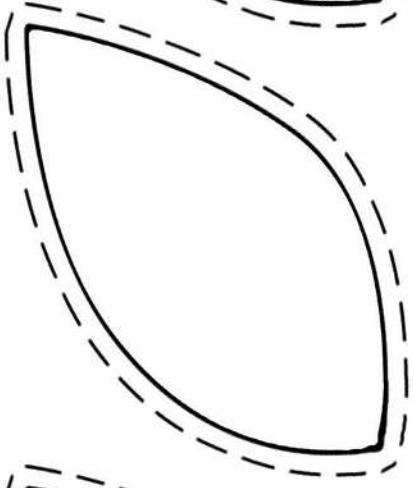
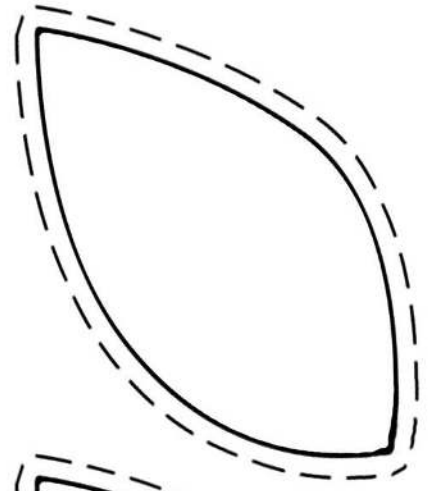
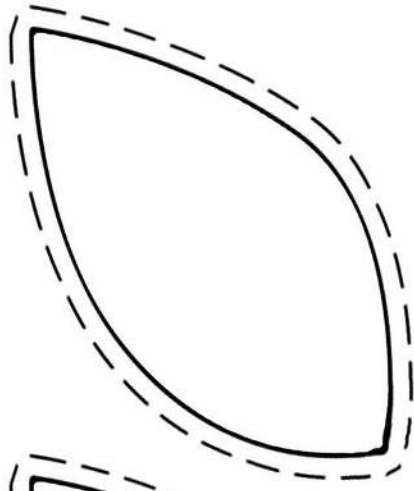
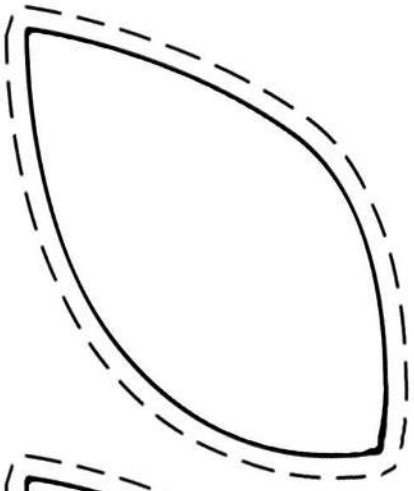
You will need:

1. Blank leaves printed template.
2. Thick paper or cardboard.
3. Scissor.
4. Glue.

Instructions:

1. Cut strips of thick paper or cardboard 3/4-inch-thick for the headband.
2. Cut out 12 leaves for each wreath.
3. Using the glue stick, add the leaves to the band starting at the back and working forward (This works best if each new leaf is glued under the previous leaf).
4. Once all the leaves are glued on, attach the end of headband to close the wreath loop.





Zeus's Lightning Bolt

It needs 3 pieces of A4 paper, attached to each other to get a full shape.

1. Print out the template on A4 paper.
2. Cut out by following the shape.
3. Attach it together by gluing it.
4. Stick the cut bolt onto thick paper or cardboard.
